phrase that was ACTUALLY, that invented because some of the most successful gold rush miners were Irish Americans and nobody did a fact check. St. Patrick's Day is the time of year when most people remember the phrase. I know it was a lucky day for me. It's my wedding anniversary (48 years but who's counting). But for us alcoholics, we should feel lucky every day. After all, many who have this disease succumbed in one way or another. They may have wrapped their car around a tree or just poisoned their body so much that it guit working. We have been very, very lucky to make it far enough to get into these rooms. So in the immortal words of Dirty Harry, 'Do you feel lucky punk? Well do ya?'

Me, I feel the same way about luck as I do about coincidence. There ain't no such thing. We live in a causal universe. For everything that happens, something caused it to happen. Cause and effect. Action and reaction. Even a flip of a coin. Your thumb is under the edge of the coin and the muscles in your hand contract driving the coin into the air where gravity brings it down, you catch it and flip it to the back of your hand and uncover it. Heads or tails is only a game of chance because we cannot adequately measure the force of your hand muscles, air pressure, etc.

Now in most cases, it's easier to see the effect than the cause. Otherwise people wouldn't keep doing the same thing and expecting different results. Now in my opinion, the cause of many events in my life is the intervention of my higher power that I call God not luck. Other people keep pealing back the onion looking for the root cause. That is a worthwhile pursuit but I just take the short cut. There comes a point where you have to just accept the obvious. I have a degree in math and I had a professor in college do a proof on the board and at one point said, 'And from here it's obvious'. He then got a faraway look and walked out of the room. After a while, he came back into the room waving a bunch of papers and said, 'Yes. Its obvious'.

My higher power dragged me into AA kicking and screaming. I didn't want to stop drinking until I was forced to. I did pray a lot to help me control my drinking but quit? Not so much. Little by little, Step by Step, I was painted into a corner where I couldn't escape the conclusion that I could never drink again. I had heard of AA of course but I had no idea what it was about. The day after I got out of rehab I went to my first meeting and never looked back. You can call it lucky that I knew someone in the program and that the group's meetings were the day after I got out of rehab and that I felt so welcome from the first meeting but I call it the effects of God working in my life.

# TRADITION THREE

*"The only requirement for A.A. membership is a desire to stop drinking"* 

**IN** our book we read that alcoholics tend to be 'extremists' by nature. It also suggests that we suffer from an insanity composed of "lack of sense of proportion" and "a lack of perspective." Alcoholics Anonymous also exists within society—not outside it. This means that many of the attitudes, crusades, prejudices, and theories that pervade the larger society also find their way into our wonderful fellowship. This is ever so true when we consider the Third Tradition.

In recent years, in society at large, there has been an outcry for "inclusiveness." A number of organizations have been founded to pursue this goal from a wide variety of perspectives. To some degree one could almost read the description. Regarding sex in the Big Book and the description would fit pretty well. In my understanding, when the same thing applies to a variety of circumstance, there is an underlying principle at work. This "inclusiveness" crusade has found its way into the conversation within Alcoholics Anonymous. The term has surfaced quite often in the deliberations of our General Service Conference. So let's examine whether the shoe fits AA or not.

Sadly, those who claim that A.A. is not inclusive have obviously never read the history of the experiences that went into the development of this tradition. And that fact, by itself, is incredibly sad and alarming. Almost suggesting that perhaps that our "Public Information" focus ought to be an internal effort of education rather than an external one. This story leads to that suggestion.

One day at the 24th Street Club in New York a fellow came wanting to get sober. In the standards of the 1930's he was about as offensive

a person as one might find. He was an alcoholic, a Black man, a homosexual transvestite crossdresser and a drug addict. He was stopped at the door and a discussion ensued as to whether he could become a member in his hopes to get sober. Finally, the fellows having this discussion realized that they could resolve the question among themselves-so they consulted with Bill Wilson. He pondered the situation a bit and he asked a question: "Fellows, did this fellow say he was alcoholic?" The response from those at the club was that indeed the person had said he was alcoholic and was seeking to get sober. Bill's response was that this was the only question, or standard, we might impose on anyone seeking A.A. membership. And so began the development of Tradition Three.

The 'inclusivity' exhibited by that story suggest that A.A. has always been an inclusive society. As a matter of fact, in the very early days you weren't even allowed into a meeting until you had convinced a delegate of the groups members that you were alcoholic. SO when the concern is expressed that A.A. isn't inclusive-it is expressed by those who haven't learned or don't understand our history. Which is an interesting way for the pot to call the kettle black. Those who have failed to take the time to study what they actually belong to, and the principles under which it operates, are actually "excluding" important information in their consideration. Generally, operating this way is called the development of a prejudice.

Now we come to the heart of the matter prejudice. Alcoholics Anonymous, as a society or fellowship, cannot afford prejudice in its decision-making. That would be to place 'personalities before principles.' However, because we have avoided becoming a government or business hierarchy—we cannot impose any course of action, or manner pf thinking on the groups who call themselves A.A. groups. As we all know so well today, governments and businesses can operate by mandate, imposing certain ways of acting on those under its control. Alcoholics Anonymous does not have that ability, and wisely so.

However, any discussion of 'prejudice' to be

complete must review both the 'prejudice for' as well as the 'prejudice against' the focus of the discussion. Bearing that in mind, Tradition Three suggests that we set aside any prejudice we may have - either for someone becoming an A.A. member, or against them becoming an A.A, member. This brings things to a very simple level. The question, as Bill saw in his consideration, is whether or not the person believes themselves to be alcoholic and whether that is what they want to focus on in the meetings. No doubt virtually all of us has things in our lifestyle or personality that could use some attention. Often this is where good sponsorship is invaluable, and where a professional outside A.A. may need to be consulted. Alcoholics Anonymous groups are presented with a great enough challenge to simply provide the 'recovery space' for alcoholism. To take on any more might be determined a 'fools task' in the making. Just another reason for Keeping It Simple!

# THOUGHTS FROM THE BOARD

**ONE** day at a time. This has become one of the slogans that has helped me tremendously over the past two years. I learned this slogan early in sobriety. One great thing about AA is that I must continue to grow no matter how long I have been sober. So, since the beginning of the pandemic, and the sense of isolation it brought, my use and understanding of this slogan has also changed. Social activities, meetings, religious gatherings, family time, work and recreation were all impacted. Every day became 'One Day at a Time' as life was so different. The meeting I attended for 9 years folded. This was very hard, especially working to find another meeting. An AA friend of mine recommended Rule 62 on Thursday nights, an online meeting. I attended several times, and although it was very different than in-person meetings, the group did as much as they could to make me feel welcomed. Each time I attended things seemed a little better. Again "One Day (meeting) at a Time". I am conscious of how difficult it must be for people new to AA to find, attend, and feel welcome at online meetings. The barriers are definitely higher than simply showing up at a live meeting with group members.

As I continued to attend meetings I heard how many in the group were involved in service activities in spite of restrictions. I heard how their sobriety benefited from this service and I began to look for opportunities. When the position of the Alt Treasurer opened up at Intergroup, it sounded like a good fit. I am an accountant by profession, and I primarily worked with small non-profit organizations. With the help of someone in the group. I sent in my service resume and was elected at the November 2021 meeting. The first meetings were informative and energetic. I met some great new people and learned a lot about the mission and the operations of Intergroup. I am grateful to be part of this organization dedicated to helping those who want to stop drinking. So you can still call it the randomness of the universe, luck, coincidence or whatever you like. As for me I will continue to see the intelligent hand of God taking me where I couldn't go by myself ... Like to my next AA meeting.

### Promises, Promises

Another promise from the big book that I find amazing is that feeling of uselessness and self-pity will disappear. I mean heck. I've had those feelings since high school. Now I understand that the Program works to resolve the regrets and resentments from your past but feelings are just feelings. They can't be just exorcised from your brain. Oh but they can. This miracle of making the feelings of uselessness and self-pity disappear is like many of the promises in the big book. First it's impossible, then it's difficult, then it's accomplished.

The useless feeling was easy to see from our drinking days. If our head wasn't killing us, it was an event. If we weren't throwing up, it was a good day. If we had money, it was an oversight. All these things made us useless to ourselves and to those around us. How many family events did we miss? How much time did we waste planning how and when we were going to get that next drink? By getting and staying sober we became useful to our family. By Twelfth Step work we became useful to society. No wonder the feelings of uselessness disappeared. We aren't useless anymore. That the feelings of self-pity would disappear is the real trick. When I came into the program it was because it was either that or the grave and I really was deserving of pity. At least from God. But this isn't pity from God, it's self-pity that disappears. It's feeling sorry for myself. And as I worked the Program and started to see the real changes in myself, there was no reason for self-pity. I am happy and whole and so very grateful.

Now there can be times when I feel useless. Like in the middle of winter when I don't feel like doing anything but watching the fire in the fireplace. And when I start a pity party that things are not back to normal because of the pandemic (not sure I remember what normal is). But those feelings are a lot more temporary than they used to be and I don't take them seriously.

So keep looking for the promises to come true in your life as you work the program. They will if you keep working.
